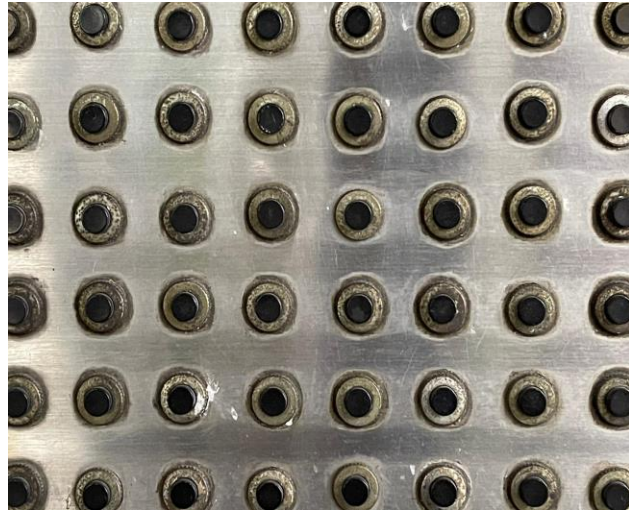

Taipa Village Cultural Association Exclusively Presents “Death and Rebirth – New Photography Works by leong Man Pan”

Contemplative photographic collection focuses on little-noticed transient moments



Macau, 4th October 2021 – Taipa Village Cultural Association is delighted to present “Death and Rebirth - New Photography Works by leong Man Pan”, its last exhibition of the year. The exhibition showcases Macau freelance artist leong Man Pan’s recent photographic works, which capture transient moments typically passed over in day-to-day life.

As a starting point for this body of work, leong recalls some of his life-changing personal experiences in search of a way to reset his photographic eye and find a reason to continue to pursue his passion. Focusing on fleeting moments normally unnoticed to the untrained eye, the uncanny framing of the subject matter magnifies the meaning of being present, being situated uniquely in a specific moment and in a particular time and place.

Born in Macau in 1985, leong Man Pan is a freelance artist who founded 1844 Macau Photography Art Space, a commercial photography studio dedicated to showing local photographic artwork. In 2008, he obtained a bachelor’s degree in advertising from Jinan University China, followed by a master’s degree in art from Chongqing University in 2012 in which he specialised in photographic art research. As an established photographic artist in Macau, leong has seen his works collected by the Macau Museum of Art, the old Albergue of the Macau Holy House of Mercy, Casa Garden, Beijing Poly and private collectors in China and overseas
